

### REPORT ON NATIONAL TOOTH BRUSHING DAY

Oral Health is essential to general health and quality of life. November 7<sup>th</sup> is observed as National Tooth Brushing Day in India to reinforce the importance of Children's Oral health and promote good tooth brushing habits recommended. The theme of the National ToothBrushing Day 2023 is "SHARE YOUR FAVOURITE TOOTH BRUSHING SONG".

As part of this day an Oral Screening camp was organized by Department of Public Health Dentistry, Azeezia College Of Dental Sciences and Research, Kollam at VVHS AYATHIL KOLLAM on 8<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

The oral screening camp started at 10am and a tooth brushing drill was also conducted along with this. Around 141 students were screened from classes 5<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> respectively. 35 students were selected from 5<sup>th</sup> class. Two interns gave tooth brushing technique (Fone's Technique) demonstration in tooth model. The distribution of toothpaste and tooth brush was done after demonstration and one child was selected among them to show the correct brushing techniques to other students. The students were divided into groups and asked to do the brushing under supervision.

After the overall screening done, there were 49 students which needs restoration, 30 for oral prophylaxis, 23 for extraction and 10 for orthodontic treatment. The camp was concluded around 1pm followed by vote of thanks by principal of the school.





## KOTTARA FEST 2024 - REPORT OF DENTAL EXHIBITION AT SMVHSS, KOTTARA

The Department of Public Health Dentistry, Azeezia College of Dental Sciences and Research, Kollam in association with NSS unit (NSS/SFU/KLM/KUHS/3) and SMHSS Kottara, Meyanoor organized a Dental Exhibition at SMHSS Kottara from 11.01.2024 to 12.01.24 under the name 'Kottara Fest'. The programme started with an inaugural function with Sri Murukan Kattakada, the chief guest. After the inaugural function various art programmes were held at the auditorium.

The Exhibition was organised from 10 am to 5pm at various classrooms. Almost 1500 students from various schools including teachers and parents came to see the exhibition. There were several models and posters on tooth eruption, dental trauma and its management, root canal treatment, oral cancer. Various oral hygiene aids which includes flossing and various tobacco products, E- cigarettes, Nicotine Replacement Therapy etc were also there. The Interns were assigned the duty to explain the posters and models to the students and teachers. A photo frame (selfie point) was also kept for entertaining the viewers.

There were also posters and models from Azeezia Medical College. Various posters regarding different diseases their prevention and also bones of human body was also exhibited. The interns and staff of the college actively participated, and they explained about each exhibit to the students and teachers.

Other institutions also participated in the exhibition. Exhibits and models including posters were arranged by Vikram Sarabhai Space centre, Forest Department, Art gallery, JRC, Zoology lab, Priyadarshini planetarium, Archaeology department, SPC, NCC army and navel. The Geology department were also a main source of attraction. There was also a science exhibition in which students from different school participated. Mobile planetariums were also there for students was also a main source of attraction to the students as well as public. A food court was also organized by Kudumbasree unit and students of SMHSS Kottara.

The local residents/public in the area also came to see the exhibits and models. The exhibition ended on 12.01.24 at 4pm and NSS unit brought back the exhibits to Azeezia Dental College.







## **Report of World Cancer Day**

On behalf of World Cancer Day 2023, an oral cancer screening programme was conducted by Department of Public Health Dentistry, Azeezia College of Dental Sciences and Research and NSS unit(NSS/SFU/KLM/KUHS/3) on 8<sup>th</sup> of February 2023, at Jyothi Nikethan Women's College from 10.00am to 2.00pm. The programme was held and organized under the guidance of Ashakiranam cancer care campaign, programme officer Mr Rinesh Antony and Caritas, India.

Among the public, awareness about oral cancer is not adequate. The oral screening was an initiative aimed at early detection and awareness of oral cancer. Public awareness about oral cancer and its risk factors and signs and symptoms can lead to early diagnosis of cancer thus increasing the survival rate of patients.

The programme began with a silent prayer and welcome speech was delivered by Rev Fr Manoj Antony Director of Jyothi Nikethan Women's College. The speaker also set as an example by explaining one of his life experiences with the cancer patients which helped us really understand the same. The keynote address was presented, by Mrs Leelamma Edward Principal of Jyothi Nikethan Women's College. She also explained briefly about causes and symptoms of oral cancer.

The presidential address and the inauguration of the event was done by Rev Dr Baiju Julian, Director of Quilon social service society. His Speech enlightened about the importance of public awareness set us an example his life of oral cancer. Dr. Aarathi Vijayan, Head of The Department of Public health dentistry, Azeezia College of Dental Science and Research felicitated the event. Dr Geethu Gopal, House surgeon of Azeezia College of Dental Science and Research presented an Awareness class on oral cancer and dental caries. The speaker gave an elaborate idea about causes, symptoms, early detection and management of oral cancer which is very useful in present scenario. It was a very informative session.

Almost 43 students were participated in the oral screening programme which is conducted under the guidance of Dr Aarathi Vijayan, with the presence of six House surgeons, Dr. Kuriakose, Dr. Marvath, Dr. Merin, DrMinzia, DrGeethu, DrMegha from Azeezia college of dental science and research, kollam.
